GRANTS

Program/Project Support (includes events)

- Support for **specific projects or programs** with defined needs, budgets, and documentation.
- For asks above \$5,000, considered **only during regular grant cycles** with annual deadlines of **Jan 1st, May 1st and Sept 1st**
- Organizations are permitted to request either a program/project OR an unrestricted application per cycle
- **Funding Suggested Guidelines:** 20% of total project cost or annual program cost

- **Requests over \$50,000:**
 - Must contact Executive Director: **Daniel KieferBach** (dan@cloudsplitter.org) **before applying**.
 - Require **additional details** w/in grant application

Unrestricted Support

- Support for **general operating costs** (not tied to specific projects)
- Considered **only during regular grant cycles** with annual deadlines of **Jan 1st, May 1st and Sept 1st**
- Organizations are permitted to request either a program/project OR an unrestricted application per cycle
- Organizations are limited to one unrestricted request per calendar year
- **Funding Limit:** \$10,000 per year
- Organizational mission must align with Cloudsplitter's Mission above
- Typically awarded to **established partner organizations**.

Nonprofit Capacity Building Subsidies

The Foundation's goal for allocating this Capacity Building support is to help Adirondack region nonprofits gain critical skills including, e.g., fundraising, strategic planning, business planning and board support. This funding will help pay for consultant support, education, training, and other capacity building and expansion needs for local nonprofits.

- **Rolling basis** (no set deadlines)
- **Funding limit:** At or below \$2,500

PROGRAMS

Childcare Excellence Awards

- Eligible participants may be nominated for multiple \$4,000 achievement awards as they move through the QUALITYstarsNY program
- Teaching and Leading Staff working in an early childhood education space (Home-Based or Center-Based, includes sole proprietorships)
- Teaching and Leading Staff engaged in full-time educational activities (25+ hours a week)
- Employer must be operating in Clinton, Essex, Franklin Counties, or in the Mohawk Nation at Akwesasne (in New York State)
- Employer must participate in QUALITYstarsNY program

- Employer must achieve qualifying stages within the QUALITYstarsNY program

Canary: Powering emergency payments to employees in crisis

- Nearly two out of three workers are living paycheck to paycheck — and that’s before an emergency hits. Canary provides an innovative workplace solution to improve the 21st-century social safety net. A sudden crisis, like a car breakdown, a fire, a medical emergency, or the loss of housing, can turn even a stable life upside down. Timely support in those moments can shape how quickly someone recovers. Temporary setbacks can become lasting financial hardship that can make employees less engaged, focused, and productive. Cloudsplitter Foundation uses Canary to partner with employers to deliver emergency payments to their workforce. Grants Advisor program

- Cloudsplitter Foundation offers a [Grants Advisor program](#) to support the grants work of nonprofits of the greater Adirondack region. The goals are to increase the amount of grant dollars coming to nonprofits, especially from outside the Blue Line, and to strengthen grants programs and nonprofits’ appeal to donors via organizational capacity building. Since late 2019, the program has facilitated 1057 grant proposals valued at \$64 million, resulting in more than \$19 million in awards to 70 local organizations.
